he final number of hospital visits for 2017 at Soldiers' Memorial Hospital was 325. In January of 2018 38 visits were made. Bob excels at this as he seems to know just about everyone in town.

In 2017 there were 1,046 visits to nursing homes and private residences. With additional programs at Champlain and Leacock Care and Leacock Long term there were 149 visits in nursing homes and private residences in January of this year.

The volunteers offer their time to visit and share conversation with our veterans. We strive to let them know that neither they, nor their service to country, no matter how limited or manner served has not been forgotten.

The visiting team has recently completed an ANAF Introductory Orientation in addition to specific orientation required by most facilities. This protocol sets visiting guidelines as well as information on sanitation, safety, fire, confidentiality, respect and accountability. All team members are required to attend this orientation. Through their efforts veterans may not necessarily be treated differently but they are being acknowledged differently. Veteran recognition and awareness is a goal not just for those visited at this time, but for all those who follow.

The visiting team volunteers are: Joan Goldsmith, Don MacKenzie, Reta Keeler, Len Thorne, Gord McArthur, Bob Dimaline, Ray Canning, Keith Oliver, Colleen Payie, Bridget LaForest and Lorelie Sydney.

Treasurer's Comments

April 4, 2018

Financial statements March 4, 2018:

Profit & Loss June 1, 2017 to March 4, 2018:

- 1. Bar sales for the 9 months ended March
- 4, 2018 were \$29,500 more than the 9 months ending March 4, 2017. Branch bar sales are approximately 14% more than last years' bar sales resulting from increased product sales over 2017 and bar price increases.
- 2. Bar gross profit for the 9 months ended March 4, 2018 is 53.8% (50.7% in 2017); Gross profit for 9 months ended March 4, 2018 is \$22,600 more than the 9 months ended March 4, 2017.
- 3. Committee net revenue for the first 9 months of fiscal 2017-2018 is \$2,200 less this year than last year mainly due to increased costs of regalia, youth education and Vets Gazette.
- 4. Ways and Means revenue for the 9 months ending March 4, 2018 is \$2,100 more than the 9 months ending March 4, 2017 resulting from increased dances and meat draw revenues of \$3,600 and increased pool table revenue of \$1,000 offset by increased Remembrance Day costs.
- 5. Normandy room revenue from the rental of the Bingo Hall is the same for both years.
- 6. Membership fees are \$3,800 more than last year at March 4.
- 7. Other income is \$3,900 less for the 9 months ended March 4, 2018 than for the 9 months ended March 4, 2017 as a result of Nevada administration revenue of \$3,000 not yet earned this year and donations \$900 less than last year.
- 8. Expenses for the 9 months ended March 4, 2018 are \$4,800 less than the 9 months ended March 4, 2017 with utilities being \$1,300 more costly; repairs to building being \$6,200 less; administration costs \$1,900 more; and wages are \$1,200 less

due to the shortening of working hours offset by wage increases on January 1, 2018.

9. Completion date for the kitchen is expected for the middle of April, 2018; \$48,400 received in cash and grant to date. 10. Operations had a profit of \$30,703 for the 9 months ended March 4, 2018 as compared to a profit of \$7,921 for the 9 months ended March 4, 2017.

Balance Sheet-March 4,, 2018;

- 1. Retained earnings at March 4, 2018 were \$42,792.
- 2. Cash on hand was \$105,770.
- 3. Accounts payable & reserve liabilities were \$95,793 leaving a net cash excess of \$8,977 at March 4, 2018.
- 4. The Bingo and Nevada bank accounts have a balance of \$4,200.

Assistance with Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC)

The Royal Canadian Legion's Veterans Services Network works on behalf of Veterans to ensure they receive the benefits they deserve. We offer assistance and information on sometimes-complicated processes.

The Legion's Veterans Services Network consists of volunteer Branch Service Officers and Professional Command Service Officerswho provide assistance at all stages of the disability claim process, free of charge, whether or not you are a Legion member. Branch Service Officers are the eyes and ears of the Veterans Services Network at the grass roots level, who often first come into contact with Veterans and their families. Branch Service Officers assist Veterans by identifying those with unmet health needs and possible benefits from VAC and then by making appropriate referrals to Command Service Officers. The Legion's Professional Command Service Officers assist at the provincial and national level providing, among other things:

- Information and advice on available VAC programs and benefits
- Assistance with the preparation and submission of disability claims
- Assistance with the claims process from the first application up to and including a Request for Reconsideration with the Veterans Review and Appeal Board
- Professional advice and assistance in accessing other programs and benefits

The services provided by Professional Command Legion Service Officers are free of charge, whether or not you are a Legion member. Our representation role is mandated through legislation.

The Legion also assists and represents still serving Canadian Armed Forces members, RCMP members, and their families.

Request assistance

Please contact a Legion Professional
Command Service Officer for information on benefits and resources you may be eligible for, or to request assistance with Veterans Affairs Canada disability claim or appeals process.

Professional Command Service Officers are mandated by legislation to provide representation at all levels of the disability claim process under the Pension Act or the Canadian Forces Members and Veterans Re-establishment and Compensation Act. The privacy and confidentiality of Veterans and their families are of utmost importance to the Legion.

Client Confidentiality

To authorize access to confidential client information, the Veteran or their designate will be required to complete and submit a Claim Application Form, with one piece of proof of identity (current and valid), to a Command Service Officer.

Royal Canadian Legion Claim Application Form

Accepted proof of Identity: Provincial driver's license; Provincial Health Care Card (excluding Alberta and Manitoba); other provincial identification card; other federal identification card; Certificate of Indian Status; birth certificate; marriage certificate; employee identification card (federal, provincial or municipal); Canadian passport

Photocopied documents must be attached to applications sent by mail. Photocopied documents do not need to be certified. Ensure appropriate service number is on photocopied documents.


