In August, the Legion's Dominion Convention will be held in Winnipeg where the Legion was incorporated in July 1926. The Orillia Legion was formed in October of 1926.

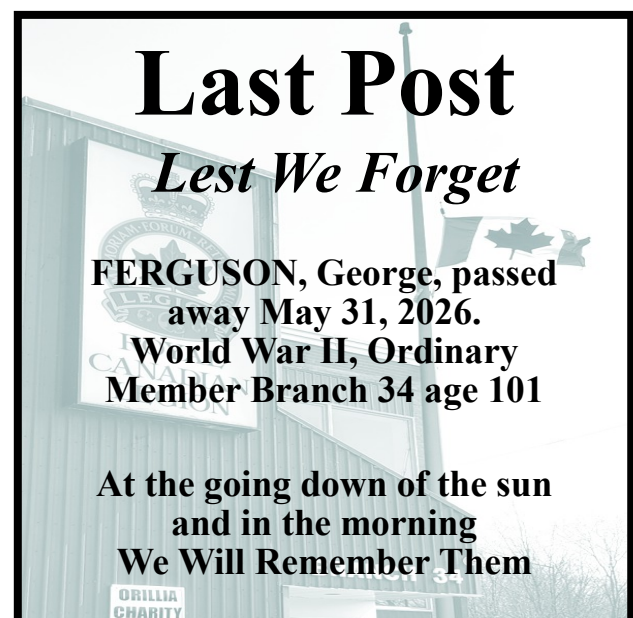

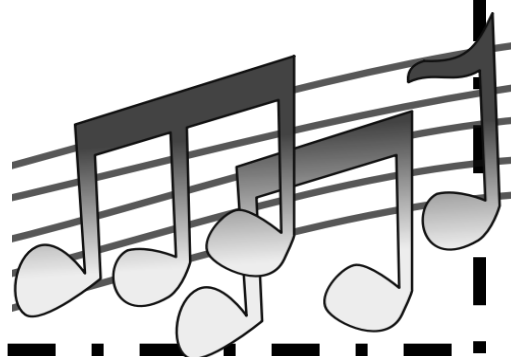

Sunday, July 19th, we are grateful to St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church for hosting the Kirkin' o' the Tartan before our afternoon

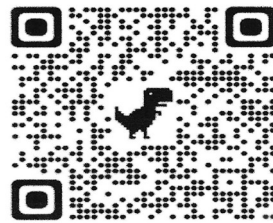

Treasurer's Comments

Financial Statements May 31st, 2026

Profit & Loss June 1, 2025 to May 31, 2026:

Detailed financial statements are available at the Branch. Financial highlights are listed below:

1. Bar revenue for the twelve months ending May 31, 2026 was \$303,880. Other revenues for the twelve months ending May 31, 2026 were Ways & Means net revenue of \$31,686 net Membership Fees of \$20,040, Bingo/ Kitchen rent of \$58,545, Scottish Festival, Regalia and Sport Committees net profit of \$14,255, and Other Income of \$57,186. Bar Gross Profit was 56.6% of bar revenue and amounted to \$171,973.
2. Geneva Bingo is held every Wednesday. Trail Walk Catering is open for Friday through Sunday breakfast in the Vimy room from 8:00am to 11:30am.
3. Building and Administration costs were \$143,318. Wages were \$180,726.
4. The Legion's profit for the twelve months ending May 31, 2026 was \$29,640 as compared to a profit of \$14,577 for the twelve months ending May 31, 2025.

Balance Sheet- May 31, 2026:

1. Retained earnings at May 31, 2026 were \$122,851.
2. Cash on hand was \$218,669.
3. Accounts payable & reserve liabilities were \$124,724 leaving a net cash balance of \$93,945 at May 31, 2026.
4. The Bingo, Nevada and Raffle bank accounts have a balance of \$23,403.

TRILLIUM GRANT – The Legion has filled a 2026 Trillium Grant for \$193,000, to cover cost of repairs to the flat roof above the Normandy room, roof of the Vimy room and for the modernization of the elevator.

ONTARIO SENIORS GRANT - The Legion has filed for another 2025 Ontario Seniors Grant for \$26,000 for replacement of the Legion's partial replacement/repair of driveway around the entries to the front of the Legion to make it more accessible, accessible toilets and Seniors programs.

NEW HORIZON GRANT – The Legion has filed a 2025 New Horizon Grant in September 2025 for \$25,000, to replace the two Cooler Thermal Doors, repainting outdoor siding and replacement/repair signs. **Not accepted.**

PIB/AVIVA INSURANCE- A tentative settlement has been reached in concern with the Orillia Legion's lawsuit for a Business Interruption Claim but it still needs to be approved by the court.

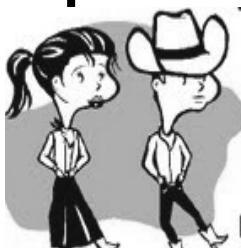

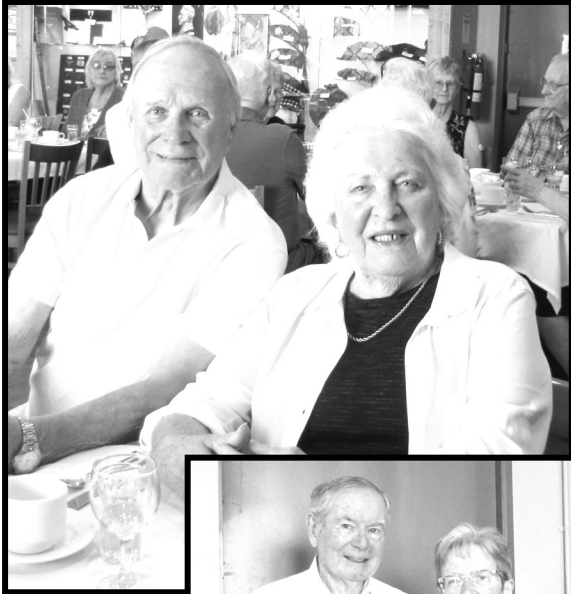

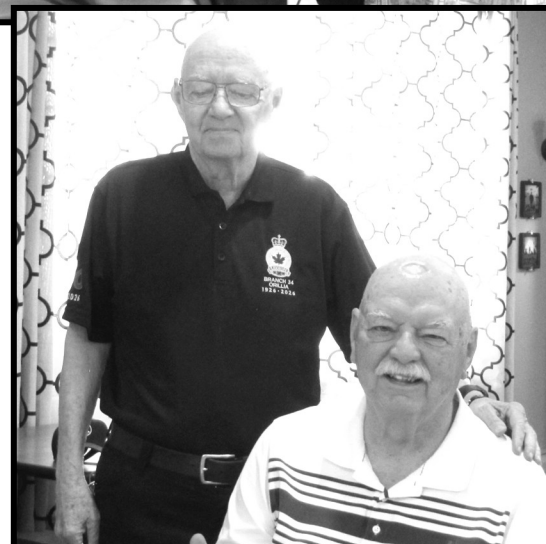

Veteran's Licence Plate

The new Veteran licence plate is available to those who have honourably served in:

- Served in the Canadian Armed Forces, including Reserve Forces, the forces of the Commonwealth, or its wartime allies;
- Served in the Merchant Navy or Ferry Command during wartime;
- Currently serving members of the Canadian Forces including Reserve Forces;
- Served in NATO operations or as a member of United Nations peacekeeping force as a member of a Canadian police service;
- Currently serving or retired members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police;
- Served in the Vietnam War in the forces of the United States or its allies during this war and who was a Canadian citizen at the time of such service.

HOW TO ORDER

First, applicants can obtain an "Application for Veteran Plate Eligibility Certification" form from any Drivers and Vehicles Licence Issuing Office, listed in the blue pages of your local phone book. You may also download your form here or on the Ministry of Transportation's Web site

(<https://www.ontario.ca/page/choose-licence-plate-graphic#section-6>).

Second, to verify their service, applicants are asked to complete this form and attach photocopies of their:

- Copy of Canadian Forces discharge certificate, Certificate of Service (or equivalent for Merchant Navy or allies), if retired; or NDI75 CF ID Card "Canadian Forces Identification Card NDI20," if still serving

- RCMP ID Card
- Police Personnel – Letter from applicant's police service confirming his/her involvement NATO operation or United Nations mission
- Vietnam Service – Statement of service or discharge certificate showing service in Vietnam during the Vietnam War in the United States Forces or the forces of its allies during this war and proof of Canadian citizenship at the time of service (Canadian birth certificate or citizenship document, which shows date of becoming a Canadian citizen.)
Send the completed form with a \$5.00 cheque or money order payable to the Royal Canadian Legion, Ontario Provincial Command, to cover administrative costs, plus photocopied service information, and a self-addressed stamped envelope to:

Ontario Command may need up to three weeks to verify the information and return an approved form.

COST Ontario values Veterans' contribution, dedication and commitment to serving and protecting our country. To honour their contribution, veterans can exchange their current plates or obtain the new veteran licence plate at no charge, once their service has been verified by the Legion. Sample veteran plates reading "000 VET," for display or gift purposes only (i.e., prohibited from being attached to a vehicle), are also available at no charge to veterans whose service has been verified by the Legion.
